**Murdoch Spine: Career learning Units

Students must complete MSP100 and 6 points in career spine units. There are a range of units that can be used to fulfil that requirement. You do not need to take the career spine units in the order suggested. Refer to the University Handbook and timetable published in the academic year you intend to complete them. 2024 - MSP200, MSP201, MSP202, CRM310, CRM311, ART208, KAC102, GRD204, COM203, COM208

Criminology Units

Criminology Required Units – **must** take CRM303 and CRM307.

Criminology Specified Electives – Students must take 6 points of *Criminology Specified Electives* (see list in handbook under course code B1345).

Specified electives cannot be units within your nominated major.

Majors

Majors require 24 points each. All units specified must be completed. Students completing Criminal Behaviour and Crime Science majors have units which

overlap (see below) in each major and so the double major is 36 points (not 48 points as in standard double majors).

Criminal Behaviour Major^ - LEG100, CRM100, CRM120, CRM201, CRM203, CRM202, CRM302, CRM389

Crime Science Major# - BIO388, BMS213, CHE103, CRM100, CRM120, CRM201, CRM203, CRM301

Notes:

- Do not exceed 10 units at level 100 (first year).
- Students completing both Criminal Behaviour and Crime Science majors have 12 units that must be completed and so only have space to complete 5 additional option units.
- It is strongly suggested to take **BMS101 as an option unit** ahead of BMS213. However, this is a suggestion and BMS101 is not a pre-requisite unit or part of the Crime Science major.
- Check the university timetable each year to confirm the teaching period units run as they are subject to change.
