****Murdoch Spine Specified Electives: Career learning Units and Minor in Indigenous Knowledges and Practices (MN-IKP)**

Students must complete 9 points of spine units during their degree; Part A (3 points) – choice of MSP100 or KAC102. Part B – 6 points (refer to handbook).

If students wish to complete a minor in **Indigenous Knowledges and Practices**, students must select KAC102 Wandju Boodja (Welcome to Country) from Spine Specified Electives and meet the requirements of the Minor (KAC102, SIK200, SIK201 and COD301 OR SIK300). The minor is in place of the points allocated to general electives.

****Recommended General Electives (9 points):**

Choose from any unit in the University where pre-requisite requirements are met (at level 100 – first year). If you are enrolled to complete the **Minor in Indigenous Knowledges and Practices**, you do not take any other elective units.

+Law Specified Electives:

Students must complete 24 points of Law Specified Electives during their studies. Some Law Specified Electives are 6 points. Law Specified Electives are also offered in non-standard teaching periods (such as summer, winter, and trimester teaching periods) and students may undertake Law Specified Electives in those periods instead of during semester.

Students wishing to complete Honours should seek advice from the Honours Chair at the end of Year 2.
