Notes:

- The above serves as a guide for the recommended sequencing of units although the units may be completed in any order.
- This course must be completed over a maximum of 4 years (8 semesters).
- PSY541, which is a 12-credit point thesis unit, can be started in either semester but must be completed over two consecutive semesters. If PSY541 is commenced in S1 students should enrol in the 'Y' version of the unit and if PSY541 is commenced in S2 students should enrol in the 'H' version of the unit. Students only need to enrol in PSY541 once.
- Where possible, it is recommended that PSY599 be conducted before or concurrently with PSY541
