- The Master of Creative Arts Therapies (MCAT) is a two-year course, with the first year of study being the Graduate Diploma in Creative Arts Therapies (GDCAT).
- The MCAT is a 48-credit point course in total, with 24 credit points of advanced standing coming from completion of the GDCAT.
- The GDCAT and MCAT can be studied full-time or part-time.
- With a semester 2 entry, the MCAT can only be studied part-time across three semesters.
- Students must choose between CSL677 Counselling Research Project (6 CP) and CSL620 Counselling Research Project (9 CP) which are year-long units commencing from S1 to S2 only.
- If CSL677 Counselling Research Project (6 CP) is chosen, a 3 credit point elective must be taken.
- The pathway above for the MCAT year is an example only. The sequence in which to study the units vary from student to student and an individual pathway is designed in consultation with the Academic Chair and Clinic Director at interview for the MCAT year.
