Lesson Plan

- Class Q&A
 - Slide 3. Ask the students to raise their hands if they know anything about Black Cockatoos. If some put their hand up ask them to share. Prompts:
 - Where have you seen them?
 - What did they look like?
 - What were they doing?
 - Slide 4. Ask if anyone knows about the different types of Black Cockatoo we see around Perth. Prompts:
 - Do some have different coloured tails?
 - What colours have you seen?
 - Do some make different sounds?
 - What sounds have you heard?
 - Have you ever heard of a Carnaby's Cockatoo? (This might already have come up above).
 - Slide5. Look at the pictures of the three types of Black Cockatoo in WA.
 - Ask the students if they can see any differences between the Cockatoos in this picture?
 - Can they guess which ones are the Carnaby's Cockatoo?
 - There is a male and female of each type in this picture... can you guess which is which?
 - Slides 7 16. Look at each slide
 - Ask if they can guess which type of Black Cockatoo is in each picture?
 (Answer is always on the next slide).
 - Slide 17 20. Summarise the differences and similarities between Carnaby's Cockatoo and Forest Red-tailed Black Cockatoo.

- Black Cockatoo themed learning activities
 - Slide 21 23. Slides to match some of the learning activities you may choose to use.
 NOTE: For younger age groups it is recommended to keep slide 20 on the screen during the Cut & paste activity so students can use that to 'copy' where each piece of information goes.
 - You could spread these activities out over a few days or you could set up roundrobin/stations:
 - Black Cockatoo cut & paste activity (for younger ages keep the slide 20 on the screen so students can observe where the correct words and pictures go. Depending on your students year 2-3 should be able to complete this individually based on the mat time.

 - 4) Cockatoo Origami Card (NF-T1R Origami Card.pdf)
- Slides 24 52: Extra images of Carnaby's Cockatoo & Forest Red-tailed Black Cockatoo
 - Use for quiz style 'play' i.e. can you correctly identify the Black Cockatoo in the picture? Answer on the next slide),
 - Use to decorate the classroom or spread out and look at a few slides each morning.
- Clean up and share what we learned.
 - Depending on your classroom you may wish to gather the students together to conclude the session with reflection and sharing.
 - You could ask them to share one new thing they have learned, or show one piece of work they are pleased with.
