

All animals need HABITAT to survive. Habitat provides FOOD, water and shelter. Some animals like the Carnabys Cockatoo need different habitat at different times. The Noongar name for Carnabys Cockatoo is Ngoolark. Ngoolarks live in eucalypt woodlands with TREE hollows for breeding between July to December, but are seen FLYING through the SKY to coastal areas between January and July because there is more WATER to drink, and more NUTS and SEEDS to eat.

Baby Carnaby Cockatoos are usually born in a NEST in the hollow of a tree, and that is their HOME until they have 'fledged' and are ready for FLIGHT. Their mother and her MATE fly with them and LEAD them to the coastal feeding grounds, and back to the breeding habitat the next year.














All animals need HABITAT to survive.



Cockatoos are very social bird and can often be seen grooming (or preening) each other.


Allopreening is where one cockatoo will preen another.

Even though they have very large and powerful beaks they are incredibly gentle with them. You can really see the attachment between individuals,




